These emerging issues were identified:

Meeting of the committee for Junior Cycle English

- Online specification provides opportunities for flexible support for teaching and learning and for teacher judgement; yet a short handbook that complements the online specification is worthy of further consideration
- Establishing much clearer links between the primary language curriculum and junior cycle English (especially first year) is a priority area
- There needs to be more systematic focus on the **development of oral language skills** in junior cycle, especially their potential to contribute to the development of thinking skills, reading and writing
- Adoption of Oral Language, Reading, and Writing as strands for junior cycle English is being considered in place of Personal, Social and Cultural literacies
